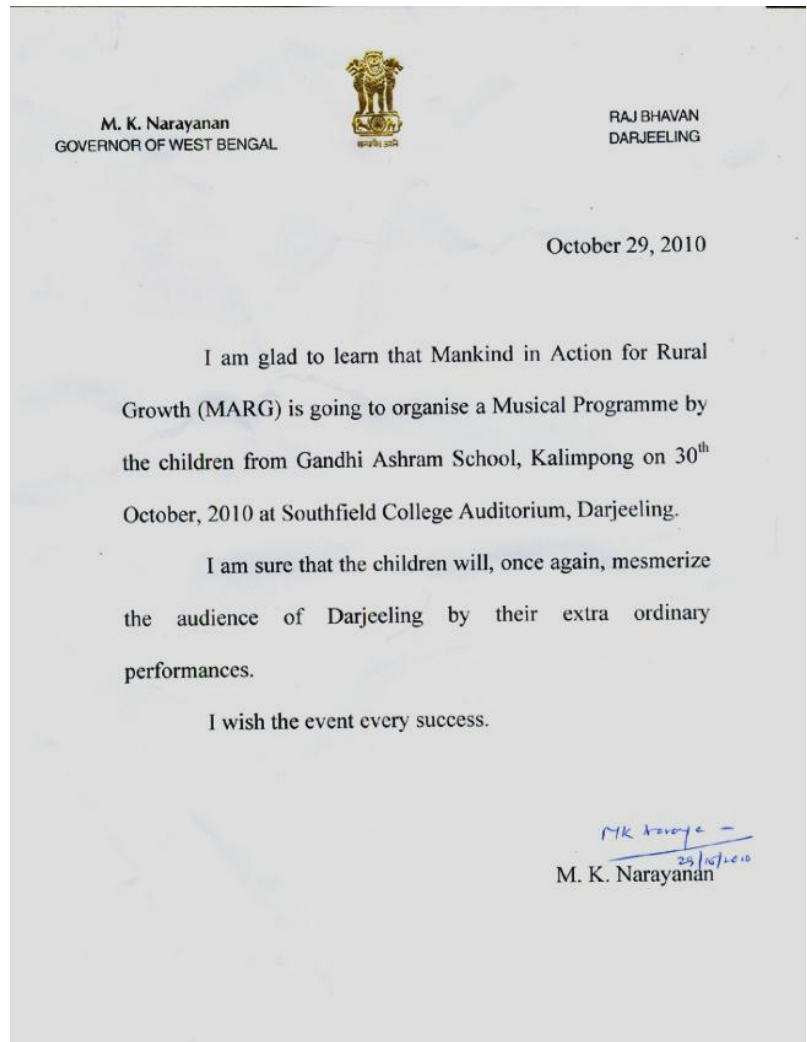
MARG and since we both were in Darjeeling, we volunteered for the fund raising event.

It was now time for the first of the performances and the Gandhi Ashram children performed an Indian classical dance. This was a surprise as the audience was not expecting an Indian classical dance by the fiddlers. There was a boisterous round of applause. This was followed by the lighting of the ceremonial lamp (dia) by Fr. Patel and some of the guests and the presenting of the traditional garland (khada) to the guests by the MARG children. Mr Nirnay John Chettri then presented the 'khada' to the orchestra conductors Mr Rudra Mani Bishwakarma and Mr. Gurung.

A very touching video on how Fr. Edward McGuire, founder of the Gandhi Ashram School, discovered the fiddling talent on the children, was shown. It made an immediate impact on the audience as the next program was the performance of the Fiddlers on the Thatch Orchestra. They performed a mix of Nepali, Western Classical and Hindi numbers and held the audience at rapt attention. Each piece was followed by a tumultuous applause and thus the little kids of the Gandhi Ashram School enthralled the audience.

Fr Patel then addressed the audience and talked a little about his life at the Gandhi Ashram school. It was then the turn of the MARG children to show off their talent. Four boys from Turnbull High School, Darjeeling sang a very melodious Nepali song. This was followed by another surprise by the Fiddlers on the Thatch. This time they performed a Michael Jackson dance on the very popular song of the 80's " Thriller". This was then followed by a Nepali Folk Dance by MARG children and then a Western Classical Dance by the fiddlers.

After this Mr Pradhan handed over the dias to Mr Chettri for his vote of thanks. Mr Chettri delivered a heartfelt thanks to all who had contributed towards MARG in general and for the event in particular. After Mr Chettri's speech Mr Pradhan announced the final act. Special Guest Artist Ms Prakriti Giri, the local celebrity. She sang one Nepali and two Hindi songs and her performance had the audience clapping and stamping their feet and singing along with her. Mankind in Action for Rural Growth (MARG) organised a Sit and Draw Competition for the children of Darjeeling. We chose this time of the year as most of the schools are closed for winters and the privileged children and families move to warmer places.

This contest was to highlight the hidden talents of children who have to stay back in the hills and do not have an opportunity to move to warmer places. It was MARG's small initiative to keep them engaged during their winter holidays. Around 120 children had registered for the contest and 68 turned up on that day from 13 schools of Darjeeling with their parents and guardians. It was for the first time that the renowned artists of Darjeeling, namely, Mr. Hemu Rai, Mr. Narendra Lama, Mr. Chendup Lepcha, Mr. Phenjo Sherpa, Mr. Kumar Chettri, Ms. Anamica Subba, Mr. Ashok Moktan, and Mr. Mahendra Thami,

were seen attending a contest as Judges.

The children were divided into two groups, Junior (from classes 3 to 6) and Senior (from classes 7 to 10). Topic for the junior group was I LOVE MY DARJEELING and for the senior it was PLACES OF INTEREST OF DARJEELING. At the end of the contest every child had a story to tell in their paintings.

In the junior section the first prize was bagged by Miss Ujjayani Chettri of Loreto Convent School. Second prize went to Miss Sikha Rai of Municipal Girls' High School Darjeeling and the third prize went to Miss Akriti Gupta of Nepali Girls High School Darjeeling. Seven consolation prizes were given to Mr. Jeetendra Sharma, Abhilash Sharma, Chogyal Sherpa, Riya Mukhia, Nishant Kumar Prashad, Ankit Pandey and Neha Gupta.

In the senior section the first prize was bagged by Mr. Akash Mukhia of St Joseph's School Darjeeling, second prize by Mr. Mihir Rai of St. Robert's School Darjeeling and third prize by Mr. Suman Sarki of Turnbull High Secondary School Darjeeling. Making Mothers Self-reliant

Four of our MARG mothers underwent 7 months of tailoring training at the Nishkalanka Mahila Udyog Kendra, Darjeeling, where they were taught from the basic hand sewing of clothes to stitching of blouses, shirts, frocks, dresses etc.

Mr. Sonam Wazilingpa, with some of his friends who are students of SP Jain of Management, Singapore, and Ms. Annie Parashar, New Delhi donated sewing machines to MARG. These machines will be shortly placed at MARG project office Darjeeling where the trained mothers would be using them.

MARG, in the days to come, is all set to come out with MARG products i.e. cloth folders, traditional dresses, shirts etc. The fabric will be bought from Weaving Destination, a rehabilitation centre where traffic survivors, domestic help returnees and PLHIV are taught to weave and become self-reliant. This is an initiative of Nedan Foundation, Kokrajhar, Assam.

Need based survey completed in Maria Basti and Kagey

People of Maria Basti and Kagey breathed a sigh of relief when electricity reached their homes on October 2010. DTH disc



were seen in some of the roof tops. Families started listening to FM music in the morning and evening and smiles could be seen on their faces. Locals started to feel that Kagey and Maria have finally taken a step towards development.

MARG, on the other hand, thinks that the use of ICT for the development of this area keeping in mind the local customs and traditions, would be beneficial. Hence, in collaboration with telecentre.org, a global program managed by Telecentre.org Foundation, MARG has completed the basic first step i.e. need based survey of this area with forty houses.

Telecentre.org Foundation supports the establishment and sustainability of grassroots level telecentres. These telecentres are public places of access to the Internet and other digital technologies that help promote personal and social development and offers crucial services, skills and opportunities to people living in remote and rural

locations around the world.

Since its launch at the World Summit on the Information Society in Tunis in 2005, the telecentre.org programme has been instrumental in setting up telecentre networks in more than 40 countries. It has also facilitated the establishment of the Telecentre.org Academy, a knowledge-sharing and training programme for telecentre operators across the globe. Recently, it has also started a Certificate Course on Tele-centres, which has been approved by IGNOU.
